










Enabling Innovation Index Ranking: 78th of 104

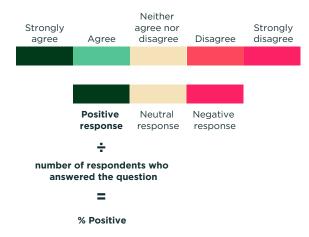
